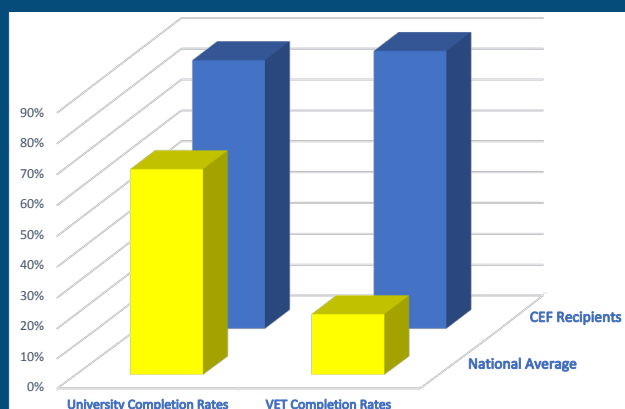

CEF conducted a survey of 1200 alumni in 2016 which determined our grant recipients have much higher course completion rates than the national average



The Independent Review into Regional, Rural and Remote Education (IRRRE) was announced by Minister for Education and Training, Simon Birmingham, in May 2017.

*"We must drive and better set policy to encourage ambition among our country students. Regional and remote students made up just **18.8 PER CENT** of domestic undergraduate students at universities, compared to making up **26.4 PER CENT** of the population in 2016."*

That represents TENS OF THOUSANDS of young people in rural and regional areas potentially missing out.

CHRIS MERCER has seen the world thanks to help from the CEF. The Cooma boy had dreams of studying theatre, and after years of building a career in Australia and overseas, is now the Head of Production at Sydney Theatre Company.

The CEF grant made him believe in himself and his dreams, no matter how unrealistic they felt as a young man leaving home for the first time.

"The grant gave me determination and confidence ... and also a sense of responsibility that I had to work hard and give myself the very best chance to succeed."

"It was a huge help, it covered all my books for the first year. The funds ease the pressure. It's a huge expense for regional students to leave home and study. Receiving a grant gives you confidence knowing someone else believes that you can achieve your goals."

Student stories

The Yass District Education Foundation, awarded **CERIDWEN BOEL** a one-off \$1000 community scholarship when she applied. She says it helped her find her feet and allowed her to find confidence.
