
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Proof in the Numbers

Despite ongoing challenges, the CEF model continues to deliver by expanding its support for rural and regional youth.

CEF's mission has long been to raise aspiration, create opportunity and enable access to further education.



The Student Impact Report is an annual snapshot that illustrates the value of CEF in the community, as well as nationwide.

The 44 foundations spread throughout five Australian states and territories continue their work to support young students in their communities. This is bolstered by the work of CEF national office and our relationships with generous and like-minded individuals, organisations and philanthropic foundations.

To say this year, and last, have been a challenge would be an understatement. Following the tragedy of natural disasters, the COVID-19 pandemic has seen us all rethink the way we deliver services, our operating structures, staff and volunteer working arrangements and all the rest! Despite this, our report captures the incredible impact of CEF in 2021, showcasing key results that have been achieved;

- 648 students received grants and scholarships Nearly \$2 million in support delivered
- Over \$14 million since 1993

This year we've managed to tick a few goals off the list, including securing new long term partnerships and growing our mentor and alumni programs.

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Aspirational Alumni

Current research shows there is a lack of aspiration to undertake further education from rural and regional students. Secondly, even when the desire is there, the location and financial barriers often seem too great. CEF's Aspirational Influencers program seeks to make goals achievable by increasing aspirations, positive thinking and understanding of further education opportunities.



The program is a tailored approach to increasing education aspirations of students within the CEF footprint. Various activities will be undertaken by our influencers, collaborating with our volunteers to determine what will work best for each community:

- Workplace visits for high school students
- Mentoring
- School or in-community talks
- Audiovisual content

These nine past and present recipients understand first-hand the obstacles facing rural and regional youth. They have agreed to volunteer their time, working with us to connect with students and communities, showing them what is possible in postschool education and how to make it happen.

V is for VET

And V is also for Victory... a game changing partnership that sees our VET sector students receive significant additional funding.

Approximately one third of rural and regional students choose Vocational Education and Training (VET) study such as TAFE, apprenticeships and short courses. This training can be more attainable (and affordable) than university study and can equip our young people to take on those all-important trades – we've all needed an electrician, plumber, mechanic or hairdresser at least once! Adding to the benefits of a VET education, wage comparison data shows the median full-time income for university graduates is \$54,000; whereas a TAFE NSW graduate is earning \$56,000...win, win!

CEF currently has education partnerships with more than 15 universities and colleges across Australia to provide matched funds (co-funding) to CEF supported students attending their institutions. Unfortunately, the VET sector does not have the same access to funding to enter into similar arrangements. We are therefore so excited to have enlisted backing from a philanthropic foundation to provide an additional \$112,000 in support to first and second year students studying in these much needed areas.

At CEF, the VET sector cohort is underrepresented (approximately one sixth of our recipients) and we predict that providing matched funding will attract more VET students applying to CEF. Additional support for these students highlights the importance of VET sector study as a valid option after school, particularly in regional areas.

With trying times impacting the fundraising abilities of our local foundations, this funding is a magnificent boost to their efforts.


