Country Education Foundation of Australia (CEF) announced the winners of the 2022 Audi Foundation – CEF Alumni Awards during an in person cocktail event at Vibe Hotel Canberra on Saturday 22nd October. After two years of online events due to the pandemic, the excitement to celebrate the achievements of regional youth was clear with 55 nominations and more than 140 people in attendance.

Elise was supported from 2016 to 2020 to undertake a Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours) at the University of Adelaide. She graduated with a 7.0/7.0 Grade Point Average, is the published co-author of two peer-reviewed journal articles, a recipient of the 2019 Adelaide Graduate Award and was selected to deliver the Valedictorian address for her graduating cohort. Having completed her Honours, she is now working as a Data Analyst at the Australian Bureau of Statistics, within the Graduate Development Program.

CEF have partnered with the Audi Foundation since their establishment in 2017, supporting rural and regional youth to access post-school education and are thrilled to have the foundation sponsoring the Alumni Awards as they celebrate five years of operations.
