Our 2023 Student Impact Report contains record breaking figures, and highlights some important areas where we're making a real difference. The Board of Country Education Foundation of Australia (CEF) has welcomed its newest Director, former CEF Snowy Monaro local foundation volunteer and committee member Jono Forrest.

Mr Forrest has had a long association with CEF, having served on the committee of CEF Snowy Monaro from 2005 until 2019. He also completed work for the Foundation as an accountant at Boyce Chartered Accountants, a longstanding partner of CEF.

He helped guide the Foundation in its early years through taxation

and organisational policy, which, according to CEF Chairman Nick Burton Taylor AM has positioned the Foundation strongly over its 30 years of operation.

CEF ANNOUNCES NEW ACCOMMODATION PARTNERSHIP WITH SANCTA SOPHIA COLLEGE



Female students supported by Country Education Foundation of Australia (CEF) now have more accommodation options in Sydney, with CEF announcing a new partnership with Sancta Sophia College (Sancta).

Sancta is a residential college located on the grounds of the University of Sydney in Camperdown, NSW, and is a great option for those enrolled at The University of Sydney, University of Notre Dame and University of Technology, Sydney, seeking a vibrant and supportive environment as they undertake tertiary studies.

It's the first time Sancta has partnered with CEF, with up to five accommodation bursaries of \$7,000 in fee relief on offer to eligible female undergraduate students for the 2025 academic year.

Known as the Sancta Sophia-CEF Bursary, they will become part of CEF's national scholarship program, 'CEF Extra'.

CEF Manager of Partnerships, Hilary Matchett, said the partnership will strengthen its suite of dedicated accommodation scholarships, providing regional women with another secure option for a place to live in Sydney.

"With an emphasis on community engagement, this partnership will give female students wider access to a well-rounded college experience; one which is focused on a balance of academic, social, sporting and community activities."

Sancta Principal Fiona Hastings said "Partnering with CEF enables Sancta to activate local networks to support young women from country towns. More than just telling young women about these scholarship opportunities, CEF volunteers provide encouragement and provide practical support along the HSC-to-Uni journey. This type of personalised community support for young women is transformative," she said.

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CEF alumnus Josie Kearney, a grant recipient of CEF Orange and District, lived at Sancta last year while studying in Sydney.

She said there were many benefits of living there and highly recommended it to future students.

"Sancta is conveniently located a short bus trip away from the centre of Sydney. The ease continued with meals provided in the dining hall, and this meant I could focus on day to day living and studying without worrying about expenses and preparing food," she said.

Any female student who receives support from a local CEF foundation and has an offer of place at Sancta in undergraduate accommodation in 2025 will be eligible to apply for one of the bursaries.

Information on how to apply for the Sancta Sophia – CEF Bursary will be available on our website from 1st July.
