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SANCTA IS THE HOME AWAY FROM HOME REGIONAL YOUNG WOMEN NEED

For Country Education Foundation of Australia student, Bridget Ritter, needing to relocate 700km from Collarenebri in western NSW, to Sydney for her studies, meant she needed to find a "home away from home".

Being so far away from her family, she wanted to live somewhere that she could feel comfortable and develop a support network of other regional young women.

When she visited a friend at Sancta Sophia College (Sancta), she found a place that would provide the supportive environment she needed while studying a Bachelor of Medical Science at the University of Technology Sydney (UTS). She wasted no time putting in her application.

Sancta is an all-female undergraduate residential college located on the grounds of the University of Sydney that provides high-quality academic, social, sporting, cultural and leadership opportunities.

With UTS only a short 10-minute bus ride up Broadway, Bridget said this made it very convenient for her.

Bridget said this had made her move to Sydney much easier and that students planning to study at University of Sydney, UTS or University of Notre Dame next year shouldn't look past Sancta.

"Sancta has become a home away from home for me. It has meant that I have the space and time to adjust to university life with girls who are also from regional places, who also feel a little daunted but excited about moving to the city. Any young woman who is looking to pursue further education in Sydney should consider Sancta Sophia College," she said.

Sancta Principal, Fiona Hastings, said its partnership with CEF would enable more regional women to pursue their university dreams in Sydney.

"At Sancta, we understand the challenges regional students face when moving away from home for their studies. The majority of our students come from regional NSW, so we have plenty of support in place especially for them," she said.

Sancta is the latest residential college to partner with CEF to offer accommodation scholarships. Applications for the Sancta Sophia College–CEF Bursary are now open.

First year female students who receive a grant from a local CEF foundation and have an offer of place at Sancta in undergraduate accommodation in 2025 are eligible for selection.

To apply for the Sancta Sophia College–CEF Bursary you will need to apply to both Sancta and your local CEF foundation. Applications for the Sancta Sophia–CEF Bursary close on 1st October 2024 while closing dates for applications to local foundations vary.

BOOT BASH CAMPAIGN PROVIDES MORE THAN \$170,000 IN TOP-UPS FOR CEF STUDENTS

Students supported by CEF this year have been given a boost, with a total of \$173,775 paid to them to help tackle the cost-of-living crisis thanks to the inaugural Boot Bash campaign and a significant philanthropic contribution from an anonymous donor.

A 15% top-up was paid to students based on the grants they received from their local CEF foundations using funds raised from the Boot Bash in March.

CEF CEO Wendy Mason said the additional funds would help students cover their educational expenses in the face of rising costs and help them continue their studies, traineeships and apprenticeships.

She said her Findex Community Fund-CEF scholarship would help her access practical learning and work experience opportunities that were critical for her succeeding in her studies, particularly livestock handling.

ST ANDREW'S SCHOLARSHIPS UNLOCK A STRONG COMMUNITY FOR REGIONAL YOUTH

The Country Education Foundation of Australia (CEF), alongside longtime partner, St Andrew's College, are thrilled to announce the extension of their partnership, with an increased financial commitment until 2027.

St Andrew's College, a residential college located on the grounds of the University of Sydney, has partnered with CEF since 2016, supporting 59 students with accommodation scholarships to the value of almost \$500,000 and providing a supportive environment for regional students to live, study and thrive in Sydney.

St Andrew's College Principal, Rob Leach, said the College had a core focus of supporting students from regional areas and enabling them to access tertiary education in Sydney.

"We are deeply committed to supporting students from rural and regional backgrounds," he said.

"We understand the unique challenges these students face in accessing higher education. Beyond the typical academic demands, they must contend with the substantial costs associated with relocating and living away from home, which can often be overwhelming."

For Isaac Barrett, the scholarship was the reason he was able to begin his studies in Sydney this year. Inspired by his older brother, Lachie, he dreamed of studying at the University of Sydney and living at St Andrew's College.

But with the cost of relocating over 500km away from his hometown of Coonamble, NSW, plus leaving behind a close-knit community and support network, he was hesitant about how he could make it all work.

He said the scholarship unlocked the opportunity to build connections and form friendships in the thriving community at St Andrew's.

"The scholarship has reduced the stress of moving from a small rural town to Sydney to pursue my studies. I love living in such a positive community environment at St Andrew's and have made friends that will be for life," he said.

For Anna Hunt, hailing from Grenfell in Central West NSW, population 2,500, the support of CEF and St Andrew's College has helped her excel in her Nursing studies at the University of Sydney. Anna now holds the Cultural Secretary role on the College's 2024 House Committee.

As a previous recipient of the scholarship, she has continued living at St Andrew's College this year, saying its environment and network of like-minded students make it a great option for regional students studying in Sydney.

"Transitioning from a small rural school to Sydney was a challenging adjustment, but the community and support provided by CEF has significantly eased this transition, making the past three years a comfortable and enriching experience," she said.


